

The Thames Discovery Programme is a multi-award winning community archaeology project. The project effectively engages people of all ages with the fast-eroding archaeology of the River Thames. Alongside our Thames Discovery Programme team, dedicated and enthusiastic volunteers and CITIZAN scientists work throughout the year to record and monitor the foreshore archaeology and erosion. Without their work we would not be able to uncover new knowledge that explores how the rich history of the Thames has shaped the evolution of London as a great city throughout the ages.

CITIZAN

CITIZAN – Coastal and Intertidal Zone Archaeological Network – works across the country to record, monitor and promote the thousands of significant and fragile archaeological sites along England's coastline that are constantly under threat from coastal erosion.

The CITIZAN team work with a host of volunteers from around the country in a joint effort to monitor the 6500+ miles of English coastline. Together these CITIZAN scientists work to create a fuller picture of our intertidal zones. CITIZAN archaeologists support communities of volunteers with training in how to recognise and record archaeological features in their local area, from prehistoric forests to 19th-century shipyards.

You can support CITIZAN by registering online as a CITIZAN surveyor, downloading the app, and coming along to a training session in your area to get hands-on with archaeology.
