Discover Archaeology



What do you think it was like where you live 2000 years ago? Would you like to find out?

2000 years ago, it was the **IRON AGE**. This is part of 'prehistory', which means people didn't write anything down. The only way we can find out about their lives is through **ARCHAEOLOGY**.

Do you know what archaeologists do?

Archaeologists work with companies like **National Highways**, who build **new roads**. Before the new road is built, we look for clues (**evidence**) from the past buried underground. We carefully remove and study them; they can tell us what life was like for people who lived a long time ago. We also ask a lot of **questions**. We use the evidence we find in our **excavations** to help us answer them.

Archaeologists do lots of different jobs. Whether you like **digging**, **computers**, **maths** or **drawing**, there is something for everyone!

Things an archaeologist might do:



Dig (excavate) places where people used to live



Collect **photos** and **information** to make maps or models of sites



Clean and **study** objects to find out what they are



Look at the **soil** to find the remains of **plants** and **animal bones**
