ROMAN

Very rich Romans had underfloor heating in their villas called hypocausts.

Hot air from fires was blown into channels under the floor.






People used to think the Romans brough over stinging nettles but this fact was made up in the 1500s.





In Bedfordshire and Cambridgeshire we have found the remains of large jars (called amphorae) the Romans used to bring olive oil to Britain.





The Romans brought over a lot of the **fruits** and **vegetables** we eat today, but not peas.

In fact, **peas** and **beans** were some of the main foods eaten in Iron Age Britain.

Romans used a thin metal stylus to write on wax tablets.

Like a **pencil**, the stylus marks could be rubbed away.

Fresh water
was brought to towns
by aqueducts.

The Romans also built drains to keep the streets and houses clean.

RASPBERRIES



Raspberries

were a favourite **fruit** for people living in **Iron Age** Britain.

They also liked blackberries!

TOOTHBRUSHES



People in Britain didn't use toothbrushes until the 1600s.

The idea for a small brush to clean your teeth originally came from China!





Most clothes in Iron Age Britain were made from wool.
