

The king grants 1,000 marks yearly to Henry de Lancastre, who the king has recently made Earl of Derby. The money will be given to him from the customs of London, Boston and Kyn-geston-upon-hull. He will get this money for as long as his father is alive, or until he makes more than 1000 marks a year from his land and rent. The king also gives him the manor of Wyghton and the hundred of Northgreneho in Norfolk, and the manor of Laghton in Yorkshire. If he makes more than 1000 marks in a year, he will have to pay the extra back to the king.
